JOE BRAVO Born: September 10, 1971 Birthplace: Long Branch, NJ Residence: Eatontown, NJ

Monmouth County born and raised, Bravo began riding quarter horses in Texas at the age of 13. In 1987 he took out his professional rider's license and captured his first race the following year at Calder aboard



Daffy Doc. Bravo is a third generation rider, following his father, George, into the jockey business. In 1991 Bravo became the first rider in New Jersey history to win titles at Garden State, Monmouth and the Meadowlands in a single year. In 1997 he registered his first Grade 1 win when he guided Formal Gold to victory in the Donn Handicap. In 2004 Bravo won the biggest race of his career, piloting Lion Heart to victory in the \$1 million Haskell Invitational. In 2007 he captured a record 13th riding title at Monmouth after riding 12 stakes winners. In 2012, he led all riders in stakes victories with 11, including the U.N. and Monmouth Cup, and finished third in the overall standings. In 2013, Bravo piloted 10 stakes winners including Big Blue Kitten in the U.N. In 2015, Bravo found the winner's circle in six stakes events, two graded, winning the Grade 3 Boiling Springs aboard Strict Compliance, and the Grade 1 United Nations on Big Blue Kitten, who also won it in 2013. In 2016, Bravo won six stakes races including three graded stakes on the Haskell Day undercard with Itsonlyactingdad in the Matchmaker, Bradester in the Monmouth Cup and the Oceanport with Blacktype.

Monmouth Park meet, Mei Ling in the Lighthouse and Valid in the Grade 3 Iselin and finished third in the rider standings with 45 wins. In 2016, Juarez took home three stakes races including making it back-to-back wins in the Grade 3 Philip H. Iselin Stakes aboard Baccelo.

DeCarlo spent the 2010-2011 winter in Saudi Arabia riding first call for King Aziz. In 2012, DeCarlo captured his second Iselin Stakes when piloting San Pablo for trainer Todd Pletcher. In 2013, DeCarlo rode Bow Bells to a stakes victory in the Twin Lights. In 2015, DeCarlo took the Lamplighter Stakes aboard Nonna's Boy. DeCarlo captured the 2016 Miss Woodford Stakes atop Appealing Maggie.

Ferrer began his U.S. riding career at Calder Race Course in 1983 before heading north to New Jersey. Later that year he became the first jockey to win five races on a single





Gallardo won his first professional race in Malaga, Spain on horse named Mafra. Gallardo stayed in Malaga for a few years before moving his talents to Newcastle, England for six months. He returned to



his home country and suffered an accident that left him out from riding for a year. At the age of 22, Gallardo came to the United States for the first time and began riding in the Florida circuit at Gulfstream Park and Calder, now known as Gulfstream Park West. He stayed at Gulfstream for three years before moving to Tampa Bay Downs. At Tampa, Gallardo became leading jockey in only his second season in 2013-2014. The following year, Gallardo broke the track record with 147 wins, winning the riding title in back-to-back years. In his first season in the Monmouth Park, Gallardo finished fifth in the rider standings with 48 wins. He took home nine stakes wins including the Grade 3 Violet and the Grade 3 Jersey Shore.
